Reading for Pleasure

As you will know we took 'The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe' as a whole school text earlier this year. Work on the theme of the story included our entry to the village Christmas tree festival as well as our annual art exhibition at the Pines Calyx. We were grateful to families for supporting us by purchasing a copy of this classic book for each child which was read in class and enjoyed by all. Reading for pleasure is such an important element of enabling our children to become literate. Children benefit from reading at home and from being read to by an adult – indeed a key way for a child's vocabulary to increase is by having texts which are too challenging for them to read, read to them by a grown-up. We urge you to take time to read to and with your child up to and beyond Year 6. Recently Mrs Wallis entered a written account of the work undertaken with our whole school text into the Kent Literacy Awards. She and Mrs Hindle attended the awards ceremony on Tuesday evening and I am delighted to announce that St Margaret's School won the category of Best Promotion of Reading for Pleasure in Dover AND the Overall Best Reading for Pleasure Scheme in the Kent. We are looking forward to taking on the Summer Reading Challenge again this summer holiday – see information elsewhere in this newsletter.
