







English	<p>Phonics Play Phonics Pop – sh, th, ch, ai</p> <p>Listen to and talk about the story 'The Enormous Turnip'.</p>  <p>Who are the characters in the story? What was your favourite part of the story and why?</p>	<p>Phonics Play Phase 3 Tricky Trucks</p> <p>Can you think of any other words to describe the enormous turnip's size? You could write a list of these words in your home learning book.</p> 	<p>Phonics Play Phonics Pop – ee, igh, oa, oo</p> <p>Ask a grown up to hide a selection of vegetables around the house. Can you write a list in your home learning book of what you found?</p> 	<p>Phonics Play Phase 3 Tricky Trucks</p> <p>Ask your grown to give you a vegetable from the kitchen and study it. Is it soft? Is it hard? What colour is it? Can you write a sentence in your home learning book to describe your vegetable?</p> 	<p>Phonics Play Phonics Pop – oi, ur, ow, oi</p> <p>Draw a picture from the story and write a sentence in your home learning book that matches your drawing.</p>  
Keep reading and listening to stories. You could try Booktrust .					
Mathematics	<p><u>Recognising Numbers to 20.</u> Can you recognise all the numbers to 20? Play the game Number Bingo.</p> 	<p><u>Number Formation</u> Ask a grown up for a shallow tray or plate of flour or sand, use your finger to write a numeral from 10 to 20. Challenge a friend or grown-up to identify the number. Then ask them to write a number for you to identify.</p> 	<p><u>Spot the mistake</u> Make deliberate mistakes whilst counting up and down. (A puppet is great for this) Ask the children to listen carefully and stop you if they hear a mistake.</p> 	<p><u>Number Washing Line</u> Ask a grown up to write the numbers 1-20 on pieces of paper. Can you peg them on the washing line in the correct order?</p> 	<p><u>Ordering Numbers and Number Formation</u> Have a go at writing numbers in order from 1-20 in your home learning books.</p>
