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Gods Card Game:
To create the game: Children research and record facts about the Romans in order to create a card game. Using the information that you have found out about the gods, write a short description and draw a picture of each god/goddess, then decide on a score for each category on the card: power, skill, weapon and importance.
How to play: 2-4 players
Shuffle the cards and share them out. Keep your pile of cards in the same order.
First player looks at one of their cards and chooses a category they think their card is strongest on. Read it out. All players share the score on their card for that category. The player with the highest score wins all of the crads, which they put at the bottom of their pile. It is then their turn to pick the next category.
