This week the children have begun working on their new 'jobs'. These have been put in place in order to give the children some responsibility around the school and to act as year six role models. The jobs have been designed in a rota fashion, meaning that each group of children will get to take part in each job over the course of the next few weeks.

Some of the job roles include helping to tidy the inside and outdoor school environments (gloves, sack and litter picker provided) while other roles involve helping students in younger classes for a small part of their afternoon lessons.

It is hoped that the children will benefit greatly from these tasks. They will need to ensure:

- Good time management as they need to check the rota and complete the correct job on the correct day.
- They show they can act as responsible members of the school community; showing they can be helpful and polite around the school.
