British Science Week

This week has been British Science Week and we have been celebrating this in school with all things science! The theme of the week has been 'Connections'. The children have been taking part in activities throughout the week planned to get them excited and engaged about science. Years 3, 4 and 6 investigated connections between fingerprints. It was interesting to see how each class had taken this in different ways. Year 3 counted the whirls, arches and loops. Year 4 tried using different ways to take the fingerprints such as pencil, charcoal and flour. They found out some worked better than others. Year 6 collected lots of data and even presented it in a graph. Year 2 had looked at connections between plants and animals in the environment and created food webs. Years 1 and 5 explored connections through building bridges. They tried out different designs to see which was the strongest to hold weights.

Yesterday, in a 'Show and Tell' assembly, each class presented one of the activities they had taken part in. They showed us what they had been doing and shared their findings with the school. Science Week is a great opportunity for science to take centre stage and for the children to get involved, and really embrace how exciting science can be!

Class 3 Trip

Class 3 had a wet but wonderful explore around St Margarets village this week. During their visit to the village, they discussed different human and physical geographical features they could see. The class discovered new information about how the village previously looked and how it has developed over the years. The children thoroughly enjoyed having their morning break time at the local park. They had a wonderful time and the rain certainly didn't dampen their spirits!

Coronavirus Symptoms

On Tuesday 29 March 2022, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the <u>next steps for living</u> <u>with COVID-19</u> in England from Friday 1 April 2022.

Updated guidance

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. Children and young people with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days (day of positive test is day 0), which is when they are most infectious.

Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature. Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days (day of positive test is day 0), which is when they are most infectious.
