Class 2 trip

Class 2 braved the cold weather and visited Dover on Wednesday. Miss Fordham reports 'The children had an exciting time whilst travelling on the public bus to Dover. On arrival in Dover we walked through the High Street and counted all the different shops and types of traffic. We then spent a short while in the warmth of the museum where we looked at models of Dover in the past. For the afternoon, we headed to St Mary's CEP school where we ate lunch and the children drew detailed pictures of what they had seen in Dover. The children enjoyed their day and are looking forward to carrying out some more fieldwork around the village next week'.

Class 4 Family Assembly

This morning was our Year 4 Family assembly which focused on the life and works of the renowned Dutch artist, Vincent van Gogh.

Indoor PE Footwear

We've had a few queries recently so just to confirm, bare feet or plimsolls should be worn for indoors PE when gymnastics or dance are being taught. Trainers are not suitable for gym or dance as these are not capable of transmitting feel for the movement and the surface the children are working on. If a child has a medical reason i.e. a verruca and does not have plimsolls they should miss PE. For indoor PE lessons other than gym or dance, trainers or plimsolls can be worn, these should be clean so as not to cause hazards from slipping on wet or dry mud falling from them. Class Newsletters and Curriculum Overviews (on the school website) detail when dance and gymnastics are being taught. Message from Class 5

Class 5 are all excited to begin the new topics for 2024. We have begun this term studying William Blake's famous poem "The Tyger" which was written over 200 years ago in 1794. We have already discovered how the poet compared the beauty of the majestic tiger against the fierce side of its character as it stalks its prey deep in the dark jungle. We have composed our own individual poems in the style of Blake's 'The Tyger'. We are having great fun sketching tiger features, which we will use to help us breathe life into our watercolour portraits. We are planning to create collages inspired by this amazing poem.

Our class story this term is 'Malamander'. The main character is a twelve-year-old boy named Herbert Lemon who lives and works in the Grand Nautilus Hotel. The hotel has many hidden mysteries in the strange and frequently foggy seaside town of Eerie-on-Sea. As the hotel's 'lost and founder', Herbie is tasked with cataloguing lost things and trying to find their owners. The story opens dramatically when Herbie stumbles across a strange girl desperately hiding from the rather scary; Boat Hook man! The adventure will provide us with inspirational descriptions to help us create our own dramatic, exciting stories.

In science, we have begun experiments comparing friction and gravity. We are constructing paper autogyros and testing their aerodynamics. In gymnastics, we are learning and perfecting different styles of rolls and balances. This is developing our core body strengths. Together these form an exciting learning journey for the new year ahead.
