## Message from the Headteacher

As I write the newsletter today, the sun is shining and there is definitely more warmth in the air; dare I say it almost feels spring-like. I always feel it is a relief at this time of year as the days start to lengthen again and the temperature rises; I am sure many of you may feel the same too.

The children in all classes have been working hard this week; it is always a joy to be able to drop into classrooms to see and hear in action the wonderful learning opportunities which our teachers and support staff provide for the children. The children are rightly proud of their achievements and keen to share their work.

Children in Class 6 have been undertaking a series of swimming lessons recently. During these lessons the children are striving to achieve the following: to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m, use a range of strokes effectively and to perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations. They have been fortunate enough to be taught by local swimming instructors Tobie and Ashleigh, who have been able to assess what the children can already do and build upon their skills. We have seen some wonderful breaststroke, front crawl and back stroke so far this term.

Meanwhile children in Class 1 have been making good use of our on-site forest school. The children have really enjoyed a muddy week at Forest School. They have been looking out for signs of winter and noticing the changes in the seasons. The children used their observations to create a winter tree using twigs. In addition, they learned a simple knot and used this to help make a 'stick wand'. Also, they enjoyed some time climbing the tree and making dens with their friends. What a fun time!

#### **Year 3 and 4 Primary Athletics Event**

On Monday, Miss Brett, Miss Harkins and Mr Morris (Sports Coach) took a group of children to Sandwich Leisure Centre for an inter-school athletics afternoon. Miss Brett reports 'the children were tasked with a range of track and field events including relay, obstacle and over and under races as well as javelin, long jump and chest presses to name but a few! Our children demonstrated superb conduct throughout the afternoon and showed excellent sportsmanship; as always we were very proud of them. ### **Free School Meals**

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
