### Message from the Headteacher

Welcome to Term 4 – we are now well into the second half of this academic year!

#### **World Book Day**

Lighthouse House are busy preparing for World Book Day on Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> March. You will have already received a letter detailing how we are going to celebrate World Book Day by holding a dressing up day. Children are invited to wear a costume to school which represents a book character – it would be lovely if your child could bring the book to school too but this is not obligatory. We look forward to seeing those children who would like to dress up in their costumes to celebrate this day, if your child does not wish to dress up as a book character – which is absolutely fine – then usual school uniform is to be worn.

In addition to dressing up on the day, the children will also have the opportunity to design a book cover which will be entered into a competition. Templates and instructions for this will be sent home next week with deadline for return of Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> March.

All children will be given a £1.00 book voucher to bring home on 7<sup>th</sup> March. They can take their voucher to a local bookseller and can use it to choose exclusive, new and completely free books. Or, if they'd rather, they can use it to get £1.00 off any book at a participating bookshop or book club.

#### **Governor Recruitment**

We currently have vacancies for a parent governor and a community (or co-opted) governor. Please see some information below about becoming a governor from Helen King our Chair of Governors.

There are no specific qualifications or requirements for the role (other than you must be at least 18 years old) and you don't need to have a background in, or knowledge of, education. Every governing board needs a balance and diversity of knowledge, skills and experience whether these have been gained in a work environment or as valuable life-skills. Initial and ongoing training is provided and you will also learn on the job, working with other governors.

As a parent governor you should have a child at the school whereas a co-opted governor can be anyone who has a community interest in the school; you could have a tie to the school such as being a grandparent, aunt or uncle, or be a neighbour, friend have a local business or live in the village or surrounding area.

Being a governor is very personally rewarding. It does mean giving up some time to attend meetings, but it gives you opportunities to develop new skills and to strengthen existing ones, boost your CV, understand how the school works, meet new people and is a valuable way of serving the local community, giving you an opportunity to influence education in the area and gain an awareness of the education system as a whole. As a governor you will work with the school leadership team to drive the strategic development of the school, support and challenge the school to continuously improve and raise standards of achievement, review and approve the school budget and monitor policies and procedures.

If you work and are concerned that you may not be able to attend meetings (which generally take place during the school day or just after) then have a word with your employer – many large employers encourage employees to undertake volunteering activities and give up to 4 days a year to do so, alternatively others are happy to have a flexi approach.

If you would like any further information for yourself or someone else who you think would be interested or if you would like to put yourself forward for one of the roles please contact the school office in the first instance.
