English 	Vocabulary Ninja Word of the Day (on school website) Share the story Superworm by Julia Donaldson. You may have a copy of the book at home or you can find the story on YouTube. Please make sure you check your chosen video before showing it to your child. Play Superworm Comprehension You might like to cut up the cards and pick them from a pile or bag or maybe hide them in the house or garden (<i>can't print? Don't worry you can read from the screen or write the questions out on your own cards</i>).	Vocabulary Ninja Word of the Day (on school website) Book Review Complete a book review for Superworm. You may use one of the Book review template as a guide for what to include. You can either print one or create your own in your Home Learning Book. Book Review Template 	Vocabulary Ninja Word of the Day (on school website) Superworm was made to look for treasure for the Evil Wizard Lizard. Think about all the special things you have - this is your treasure. Can you draw and label your treasures? Then write some sentences about your treasures and what makes them special. 	Vocabulary Ninja Word of the Day (on school website) The police want to catch the Evil Wizard Lizard. Can you create a 'Wanted' poster to catch him? Remember to use adjectives to help you describe Evil Wizard. Include in your poster – a drawing of Wizard Lizard, a description, what he is wanted for and what the reward will be.	Vocabulary Ninja Word of the Day (on school website) Turn yourself into a superhero. What will your superhero name be? What will you wear? What will your super power be? Can you draw a picture and write some sentences? 
Mathematics	<u>Spaghetti Worms</u> Make spaghetti worms. Can you cut them up and order them by size? Can you measure how long each one is in centimetres? Remember to start at 0.	<u>Measuring Worms</u> Make some worms. You could use playdough, wool or pipe cleaners and beads. Can you measure your worms in centimetres and compare them? Can you work out the difference between different worms?	<u>Missing Number Worms</u> Can you ask a grown to draw you some worms with missing numbers on up to 100? For example your grown up could draw a worm writing the numbers 78 to 88, with some of the numbers missing. You then need to fill in the missing numbers.	<u>Superworm the Skipping Rope</u> Estimate how many skips you can you do in 1 minute? Can a grown up time you? Remember to count your skips carefully. You could record your results in a table.	<u>Repeating Patterns</u> Can you draw a mini beast pattern? Can you then repeat your minibeast pattern 4 times?
