







Use the book to help you recall the main events in the story. 	Draw a picture of the Singing Mermaid and/or Sam Sly and write a list of adjectives to describe them. Write 3 simple sentences to describe one of these characters. Remember to include your adjectives, a capital letter, finger spaces and full stop. 	Ask a grown up to help you write a letter from the Singing Mermaid to her friends in the ocean, about her experiences in the Circus. Will she ask her friends to rescue her? Take a walk through the text to find key pieces of information to use in your letter. 	Look at the picture from the story. Singing Mermaid Day 5 Write some simple sentences to describe what you can see. e.g. The red crab is scuttling across the sand.

<p>Mathematics</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Money</u></p> <p>In the story the Singing Mermaid joins Sam Sly's circus. Ask a grown up for some real coins. Can you and your family role play going to the shop and paying for items at the shop? For example, An ice cream costs 2p. Candyfloss costs 5p.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p style="text-align: center;">You could also play the toy shop game online.</p>		<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Pictogram</u></p> <p>Look at the picture of the Singing Mermaid at Silversands. How many sea creatures can you see in the story? Can you create a pictogram? For example, 4 seals, 3 crabs etc.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Pictogram</u></p> <p>Using the pictogram you created yesterday ask your grown up to ask you some questions. For example, How many crabs are there? How many seals and crabs altogether?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Capacity</u></p> <p>In the story, the Singing Mermaid gets put in a tank. Can you choose three containers. How many cups of water does it take to fill them? Which one holds the most? Which one holds the least?</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>

Do you like to sing? Let's all have a sing along to one of the songs in the Disney film The Little Mermaid. If you would prefer, you could just listen. These can be found on YouTube.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Singing Mermaid Art, Crafts and DT</u></p> <p>Below are some examples. Design a new luxury tank for the Singing Mermaid to live in while she worked in the circus. Build a model of the circus tent. What materials will you need to use? The pages all have glitter on them. Can you make a piece of artwork that uses glitter to make things shine? A mermaid is half human with a fish's tail. Can you create a creature that is a mixture of two or more animals?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Science</u></p> <p>The story Singing Mermaid sings to a number of different types of fish and sea creatures. Can you find out the names of anymore fish or sea creatures? Discuss with an adult how are they similar and how are they different?</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>You might even like to do some Geography and find out which types of fish live in what oceans.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Fitness Friday</u></p> <p>The acrobats in The Singing Mermaid have to practice their balancing skills. 		<p>Discuss with an adult what you like or dislike about the song. Can you hear any instruments? Is it a female or male singing? Think about the tempo, is it fast or slow?</p> <p>You could compose (create) a song that the Singing Mermaid might sing. You could use a song from The Little Mermaid as inspiration.</p>	<p>Can you create a large picture of the Singing Mermaid using collage?</p> <p>Can you make your own mermaid using different materials?</p>
