School read-along January 2021- Charlotte's Web – message from Mrs Wallis

We will be taking part in our third whole school 'read-along' event in January 2021. This year we have chosen the classic novel 'Charlotte's Web' written by E.B.White.

All children in Key Stage 2 will be reading the book together. Mrs Lewis and I will read the book to the children in Class 2. The children in classes R and 1 will be read the picture book version of the story: 'Some Pig!'





This will form part of a two week reading and writing project based on this classic children's novel. We will be using the book to teach reading skills as well as for inspiration across other curriculum areas.

In order to achieve our aim for the project we request that each child in classes 3 to 6 has a named copy of the book to be kept in school throughout term 3. We are most grateful to you in supporting us by providing these for your children. It does not have to be a new copy, however I thought it could be a great Christmas gift to add to the list. **The children in classes 3 – 6** will each need a copy in school by Monday 4th January.
