## Message from the Headteacher

### **Home Learning**

It has been heartening to see how engaged with home learning the vast majority of our families have been this week: I thank the children and parent/carers for their efforts with this. Our current approach to remote education is to keep the format we are using as straightforward and easy to use as possible for parent/carers and the children, to focus on the basics, to use recorded lessons produced externally which cover the content we want and to give feedback to the children. As with all aspects of our work this approach will be kept under review and is likely to be subject to development. In the meantime please do let us know if you are experiencing difficulties with accessing the home learning and we will do all that we can to assist.

#### **Coronavirus - Keeping School Informed**

Thank you to those parents who have continued to contact us to let us know if their child has symptoms of Covid and are awaiting a test and then advising the result of the test either negative or positive. Please could all parents and carers continue to do so, even if the child is not attending school, as we are required to report information daily to the DfE on the number of suspected and confirmed cases (just the number, no names). Also could parents let us know each day, using the usual <a href="mailto:secretary@st-margarets-dover.kent.sch.uk">secretary@st-margarets-dover.kent.sch.uk</a> email, if a pupil is ill and unable to do the set work just as you would if we were open as normal so we can make the teachers aware they will not receive any completed work that day from your child/ren. Thank you for your help with these important matters.

### **Housepoints**

From next week Class Teachers from classes 2 – 6 will be rewarding housepoints for work sent in from home. We have uploaded the housepoint templates for each house to the Home Learning page on the school website. If you have printing facilities you may use these or alternatively children may design their own version of a one hundred square. Children can mark the housepoints off their chart as they would have at school and certificates will be awarded when school re-opens.
