

<p>Literacy</p> 	<p><u>Learning goal:</u> to write a list.</p> <p>This week we are looking at the story of Superworm by Julia Donaldson.</p> <p>Listen to the story Superworm.</p> <p>In the story, Superworm was a swing, a fishing line and many more things.</p> <p>Can you write a list of three new things Superworm could be?</p> 	<p><u>Learning goal:</u> to write a simple sentence.</p> <p>Listen to the story Superworm.</p> <p>What is your favourite part of the story?</p> <p>Draw your favourite part of the story. Then label your picture or write a sentence about it.</p> 	<p><u>Learning goal:</u> to write a simple sentence.</p> <p>Draw a picture of Superworm and describe him.</p> <p>You can label your picture or write a sentence. For example Superworm is long.
