## WALT- Publish your work

You can choose how to present your information. It could be a booklet, a poster or even a power point presentation. You may choose to create a double-paged spread in your workbook.

It should include:

- A title
- An opening paragraph to introduce what your information is about.
- A pet
- A mythical creature
- Favourite game/toy where appropriate
- Current pandemic situation around the world

For example, I would probably choose a Giraffe, as they are my favourite animal.

Remember if you are unsure about the topic/subject you have chosen you can do some research into it.

- Subtitles to clarify the sections: food, habitat...
- Bullet points for listed information
- A picture or photograph with a caption
- A question to the reader - Have you ever seen a pig in real life?
- Writing in the present tense: Pigs live in, they eat, they can be found.


You can also use 2Publish or 2Publish Plus on Purple Mash to complete your fact files on. I will set a 2Do for both if you wish to use this method.


2Publish

a virtual/creative version of your text map using resources you have at home and then freeze framing different parts of your
topic/subject. You will use this information to create a text map.


This will help you to organise your information into paragraphs about the same thing - for example:

- What do they eat
- Where do they live
- Appearance?
- Fun facts

Just like a story map, you should draw pictures, write some words and draw arrows to link information.
