If you get a positive result at the weekend, during the evening or in a school holiday please email <u>secretary@st-margarets-dover.kent.sch.uk</u> Even if your child is not attending school please continue to let us know if your child has symptoms of Covid and is awaiting a test result. Please advise of the result of the test either negative or positive, as we are required to report information daily to the DfE on the number of suspected and confirmed cases (just the number, no names).
