


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Literacy

"She doesn't curl around a nest of eggs. And anyway, my mum's got more"*


Learning goal: to write labels

Learning goal: to write a simple sentence

Learning goal: to be able to count objects.

Listen to the story 10 black dots.

Can you make your own picture using black dots? How many dots did you use?



Learning goal: to be able to order numbers.

Can you make sure own number cards and put them in the correct order?

Ask a grown up to change something on the number line. For example, Turn the number 3 upside down. Can you spot the mistake?

<u>Learning goal</u>: to be able to identify one more and one less than a given number.

You will need the number cards you made yesterday.

Put them in the correct order. Ask a grown up to say a number. Can you find 1 more and 1 less than the number?


