Story in a box!




Use whatever materials you can find to create your story in any box! You can use toys you have or draw pictures to colour and stick in.

Reading

World Book Week – This week’s focus for World Book Day will be looking at: The Bad Seed

Read aloud link is [here](#).

There is also a read aloud within this week’s intro video.

WALT: Skim and scan to identify key ideas and answer questions from the text.

Listen to The Bad Seed using the link above or the reading within this week’s intro video. Use what you learn from hearing/reading the text to answer the following:

1. What is the book about?
2. Why do you think the seed is bad?

WALT: Read between the lines, using clues from action, dialogue and description to interpret meaning and/or explain what characters are thinking/feeling and the way they act.

Using what you already know about the story and listening/reading the text again, create two small mind maps on the following areas:

1. What are the characters thinking/feeling within the story?
2. In what ways does the bad seed act?

WALT: Refer to the text to support opinions and predictions (sum up what I have found/discussed/thought about; make a point/state my thoughts and ideas; find evidence in and/or around the text to support my views).

Using the story and what you know about it already, write down your opinion of the story ensuring you are using evidence from the text to support your opinion.





