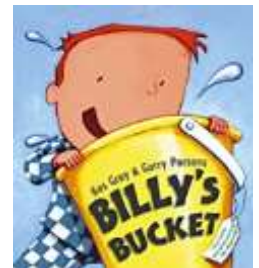
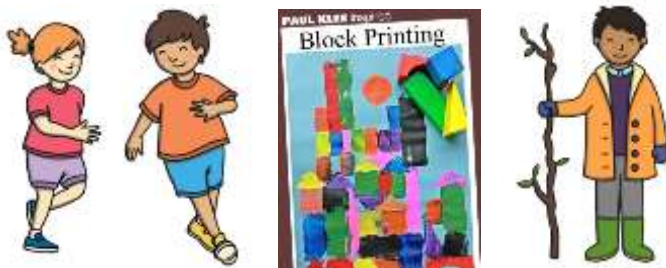

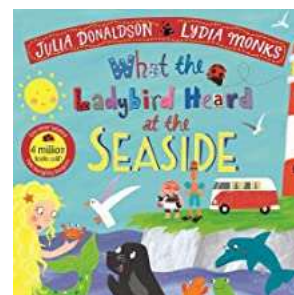

What we are learning in Term 5 . . .

This term we have some exciting new topics in our learning. We will be exploring in the forest school and learning about plants in science. We will be finding out about the Weather and Seasons. We will be learning to play the Ocarina and to make printed pictures, using a famous artist - Paul Klee, as our inspiration. We will continue our work in PE playing team games and developing our athletic skills.



Throughout the year we will read and use this book, (*Seasons come, Seasons go*) *Tree* to support our learning and development in Science, as we discover more about the changes in the seasons and study the world around us.



These are the books we will be using to support our development in reading and writing during Terms 5 and 6.

Our learning in English and Maths

English - we will continue to practice the new phonemes we have been learning in Phase 5 and to apply these both in our reading and spelling. We will begin to learn cursive letters shapes to improve the presentation of our writing.

Maths - we will continue exploring place value and ways to represent numbers to 100. Using numicon and ten frames we will count, compare and make numbers with two digits. We will count in twos, fives and tens and learn some simple times table facts.

What we are learning in Term 6 . . .

This term we will be exploring our Seaside topic and enjoying finding out about seaside holidays long ago. We will use our new learning to develop our Design Technology skills as we design and make a model of a bathing machine from the Victorian era!



In Computing, we will be using Purple Mash to explore simple algorithms and begin learning about coding. We will continue our work on belonging to a faith community by exploring what it means to belong to the Muslim community in Britain today.
