Share the words in the list with the pupils and ask what they notice about them. Underline the grapheme 'sc' in each word. Pupils write the words in their spelling journals and highlight the tricky parts. Pupils practise writing the words.

They can then share them with the class.

Viking invasion in Brimington

VICIOUS Vikings have invaded Brimington.

The attack happened in the early hours of Sunday night when over a 100 of the pillaging Norse invaders descended on the sleepy hamlet in Mercia
