Forest school activities for home learning

Nature Photo Frames

You will need:

- four large sticks or twigs
- a selection of stones
- a selection of leaves

• grass



a selection of flower
petals
heads and stems

The Activity:

- Go on a nature treasure hunt around your garden or near to your home. Allow your child to be creative and search out lots of different items, collecting as many items and colours as possible.
- Decide with your child what material they would like their photo frame to be made out of. It could be made from sticks, flower stems, wooden planks or even lots of small stones. It could even be a mixture of different items, depending on what you find.
- Create your photo frame making a square shape.
- Using your collected items, create a picture inside your photo frame. Your child could create a portrait of themselves or a picture of something that makes them happy e.g. a pattern, a place, another person or an animal.

Outdoor Activity

You will need:

Mud

Trees

Natural found items, e.g. sticks, leaves, pinecones, stones Water

The Activity

- 1. Mix the mud with a little water to make it more pliable.
- 2. Add the mud to a tree trunk and begin to design and sculpt a face.
- Use sticks to add texture to the mud sculpture. Add any natural materials to the face that the children choose, e.g. stones for eyes and leaves for hair or ears.
