Covid

Thank you for your attention to the letters regarding Covid-19 infection within our school community. You will have seen that we have had quite a spike in transmission in the last 10 days. I thank you also for your following of the government guidelines and for your timely communication with the school office staff.

It is lovely to see children who have been isolating at home following positive LFT or PCR tests, starting to return to school.

As you will all know we continue to have newly identified infections within most of our classes and all classes are still within a seven day daily Lateral flow Testing window – see separate letter already sent out today.

I have checked with our Area Education Officer today and the guidance remains that those returning to school, after isolating with Covid, should also Lateral Flow Test daily if they come into contact with someone who tests positive eg a classmate. If they get a positive result they should start a new period of isolation. Parent/carers of returnees will need to keep an eye on the letters advising of infection within the class so that they know if their returning child has been at school on the day of a newly identified infection.

Thank you for your attention to this – I am sure, like me, you long for days when we no longer need to think, read or write about Covid-19!

Coronavirus Symptoms

Updated Guidance

From 11 January in England, people <u>without</u> symptoms who receive positive lateral flow device (LFD) test results for coronavirus (COVID-19) will be required to self-isolate immediately and won't be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.

Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms should stay at home and self-isolate and get a PCR test (see below). They must self-isolate if they get a positive test result, even if they have had a recent negative lateral flow test – these rules have not changed.

Children or staff with <u>any</u> of the three symptoms of Covid:

- a new continuous cough;
- a fever:
- a change in taste or smell

are to stay at home and isolate. They should get a PCR Covid test.

Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for COVID-19

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

Daily testing for close contacts of COVID-19

People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, <u>should take an LFD test every day for seven days</u> and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Keeping School Informed

If your child tests positive for Covid you must inform the school – by telephone on 01304 852639 during the school day. If your child tests positive 'out of hours' we do not need to know until the morning of the first day of absence – as with all sickness absence.
