We observed the annual Number Day in school today with all things numerical!

Thank you to everyone, big and small, who has worked so hard on creating rock star and number superhero costumes. In their classes the children have been using film as inspiration for their maths work. Year R were inspired by Charlie and the Chocolate Factory to build a pictogram about their favourite chocolate. Year 1 used the film 101 Dalmatians as inspiration to count spots on dogs and then double the spots, they also counted bones in groups of 2s, 5s and 10s. In Year 2 the Lego Movie inspired Lego tower board games being built.

Despicable Me was the film for Year 3 through which they searched for maths clues before visiting the computer suite to complete some Timestables Rockstar quizzes. Year 4 watched Monsters Inc. and then used a number generator to create their own monster. Year 5 used Alice in Wonderland to play card games and completed an array of challenging problems around the characters Alice met down the hole. Coronavirus Symptoms

Updated Guidance

From 11 January in England, people <u>without</u> symptoms who receive positive lateral flow device (LFD) test results for coronavirus (COVID-19) will be required to self-isolate immediately and won't be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.

Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms should stay at home and self-isolate and get a PCR test (see below). They must self-isolate if they get a positive test result, even if they have had a recent negative lateral flow test – these rules have not changed.

Children or staff with <u>any</u> of the three symptoms of Covid:

- a new continuous cough;
- a fever;
- a change in taste or smell

are to stay at home and isolate. They should get a PCR Covid test.

Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for COVID-19

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test and Trace</u>

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to selfisolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

Daily testing for close contacts of COVID-19

People who are fully vaccinated, or children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, <u>should take an LFD test every day for seven days</u> and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result or develop symptoms at any time.

Keeping School Informed

If your child tests positive for Covid you must inform the school – by telephone on 01304 852639 during the school day. If your child tests positive 'out of hours' we do not need to know until the morning of the first day of absence – as with all sickness absence.
