Maths

Our focus within maths for the next two terms will be:

English

Within English for the next two terms, we will dive into a selection of genres, such as:

- Persuasive Writing
- Story writing
- Recount
- Poterv

We will use our Talk for writing process for this in order for the children to dig deeper into a piece of text.

Foundation Subjects

Our foundation learning over the next two terms covers a variety of areas, which are:

- Art and Design Printing and sculpture.
- Computing Databases and stop motion animation.
- **Design and Technology** Cooking nutrition, pizza art and Construction abstract clock.
- Geography Types of settlement and land use
- History Vikings and Anglo Saxons.
- French What is the time?, Holidays, and Hobbies.
- Music Recorders and composing.
- **PE** Cricket/Tennis/Rounder's.
- **PSHE** Changing me.
- RE Why is Jesus inspiring to some people? Why do some people think life is a journey?
- Science Animals including Humans and Investigations.

Just a Few Things to Remember...
