Message from Class 4

Class 4 have had an enjoyable week finding out about the Roman invasion of Britain, right here on our very own doorstep!

Centurion George explained how Gaius Julius Caesar attempted to invade Britan on the beaches of Walmer. Next time you are at the beach, look out for the Roman statue on the seafront. He also introduced us to the clothing and weaponry Roman soldiers would have used, as well as their successful military tactics. It's fair to say, a Roman army of class 4 would have scared off any Celtic tribes!

In Literacy, we have begun writing a non-chronological report about spiders. This has also helped us with our classification of animals as part of our Science. Ask us to name all 6 groups of animals. Coronavirus Symptoms

On Tuesday 29 March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the <u>next steps for living with COVID-19</u> in England from Friday 1 April.

Updated guidance

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. Children and young people with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days (day of positive test is day 0), which is when they are most infectious.

Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature. Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days (day of positive test is day 0), which is when they are most infectious.
