

Message from the Headteacher

Working in partnership with you

It was good to see so many of our parent/carers in school this week for meetings with the teachers. This is a really important time when you can look at your child's workbooks – they are so proud to share them with you – and talk with the teacher about how your child is getting on. It is a great opportunity to talk about things like how you can help at home with reading or homework, to raise any concerns you may have and to talk about things which might be bothering or concerning you. I know how much the staff appreciate getting to know you and working together for the best of your child.

We will be making contact with anyone who was not able to come into school this week to make another appointment and look forward to seeing you then.

Cognitive Abilities Tests (CATs)

At St Margaret's CP we undertake a range of assessments throughout each school year in order to better understand how the children are getting on with their learning and to help with planning to meet their needs. One of the assessments we use are CATs which the children take at the beginning of Year 4 and again at the beginning of Year 5 and then in the summer term of Year 5. These tests assess how well a pupil can think about tasks and solve problems using a range of different questions. We use the tests three times as the format is quite unfamiliar to the children so they need practice in order to get used to them. Often results are lower at the start of Year 4 and increase throughout Year 5.

Parent/Carers in Class 5 have recently received their children's results and Class 4 results will be sent to parents next week. Please don't hesitate to speak with the class teacher, Mrs Hindle or me if you would like some clarification about the results. The tests are very similar to the Kent Test which some children will take at the start of Year 6 if they would like to go to one of the grammar schools. This is another reason why we use them so that we can help parent/carers to identify areas which the children need to work on.

Pupils have observed the 2 minute silence individually in classes this morning for Remembrance Day.

Anti –Bullying Week

Next week is our annual Anti-Bullying Week, where we will be using the 2022 national theme of Reach Out. We will be looking at, through assemblies and lessons, ways to reach out and show each other the support we all need. Coronavirus Symptoms

On Tuesday 29 March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the <u>next steps for living with</u> <u>COVID-19</u> in England from Friday 1 April.

Updated guidance

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. Children and young people with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days (day of positive test is day 0), which is when they are most infectious.

Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature. Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days (day of positive test is day 0), which is when they are most infectious.
