## Some topic highlights from our curriculum

#### History – Castle (Local study of Dover Castle)

We will be discovering why people built castles, who built them and why don't we build them anymore? We will learn about the various features of castles; linking this to a Medieval art project. We will investigate the people who lived in castles, from Kings and Queens to the kitchen staff. Class 3 are going to go back in time to when Dover Castle was first built and find out why the castle is so important to our local history. We will also be learning about the patron saint of England – St. George as well as learning about dragons through our Art and English work.

We will be learning about Forces and Magnets in Science, as well as completing some printing in Art using the natural environment as inspiration.
