
Year 1 Newsletter Summer Terms 5 and 6 2023

We have another busy term ahead of us with lots of new and exciting learning!







In Term 5, we will enjoy learning about . . .

Plants! We will become plant detectives and learn how to find out more about the plants in our habitat. We will begin learning to play the ocarina. We will continue our work in PE playing team games and developing our athletic skills. Using lots of stories, we will be reading, writing and re-telling together. We will enjoy celebrating the King's Coronation. In maths, we will learn about fractions and turns and continue our work in multiplication and division by learning about arrays and doubles.




Thank you so much for sharing your child's proud learning moments from home. The joy on their faces as we celebrate in class is very special. We will continue with these until the end of Year 1.

Phonics and Reading

In phonics we will continue with our learning from Phase 5 using Little Wandle. We will be sending home the CEW (common exception words) or 'tricky words' and the phonemes the children have been learning. Please use these to practise the words and graphemes (sounds) with your child at home. A little reminder – we ask that a parent or carer reads with the children in Year 1 everyday for a short time. This consistent practise really is the best way to ensure that new skills are being used and that reading improves.







In Term 6, we will enjoy learning about . . .

Seaside holidays long ago. What did people in Victorian times enjoy at the seaside? What is a bathing machine? We will watch the changing seasons and learn about what happens in the summer. We will continue exploring place value and ways to represent numbers to 100. Using numicon and ten frames we will count, compare and make numbers with two digits.

We will be learning how to make printed pictures, using a famous artist – Paul Klee, as our inspiration.

We will learn about mini-beasts as we explore together outside. We will explore how we have grown and changed since we were babies.

- P.E will continue to be on **Wednesday** and **Friday** during terms 5 and 6.
- Please could all school uniform be labelled to avoid lost clothes at school.
- Please make sure your child has a named water bottle in school. These should only contain water.
