### Message from the Headteacher

### Classes 2 & 4 Out and About

Year 2 had a great day at Mr Castle's allotment. The sun was shining and they managed to avoid the rain! Miss Fordham reports 'Mr Castle introduced us to his allotment and gave us a talk about the lifecycle of his produce including roots, leaves and what they need to grow. The children engaged in a variety of activities including: digging up potatoes, rhubarb and leeks, planting vegetables such as tomatoes and cucumber and weeding. The children were able to plant their own sunflower seed and runner beans which they will be bringing home in the next few days. We would like to thank Mr Castle for a fantastic day!'

Year 4 were not so lucky with the weather on their trip to Canterbury Cathedral but this didn't dampen their spirits. Mrs Byatt reports 'As part of our workshop, we looked at some Anglo Saxon artefacts. We found out how monks used a pocket sundial to tell them when to pray. We also practised writing with a goose feather quill and learnt Viking runes. We coloured designs on stained glass windows and made our own Canterbury Cross. We dressed up as characters from Anglo-Saxon times and helped to retell the stories of the cathedral.'

Here are some facts that class 4 remember from their visit:

Archbishop Alphege used to be buried at St Paul's Cathedral in London, but is now buried at Canterbury Cathedral.

At the entrance to Canterbury Cathedral, there are statues of King Ethelbert, Queen Bertha and the first Archbishop of Canterbury.

The stained glass windows are up to 800 years old and showed pictures of Anglo-Saxons throwing rocks at the Vikings, Archbishop Alphege being captured by the Vikings and as well as images of past kings.

Canterbury Cathedral is made out of limestone and to lift the bricks to the top of the tower, they used a wooden winch.

I would also like to share the following comments from an email we received from the Assistant Schools Officer at Canterbury Cathedral. 'It was a real pleasure welcoming your lovely Year 4s to Canterbury Cathedral today – they were enthusiastic and curious and a delight to work with. Both guides also commented on how engaged the children were and the high quality of the questions that they asked.'

The children in year 6 have been completing their end of Key Stage 2 assessments in reading, writing and maths this week. I would like to commend them all for their hard work and endeavour and for all trying their best.
