### Message from the Headteacher

#### Welcome

Happy new school year to you all. Goodness me, what a hot week it has been – here's looking forward to the weather starting to cool.

All staff received statutory safeguarding update training at the beginning of this week.

In assembly on Tuesday we worked with all children and staff to talk about what makes us 'us' – we thought about our school values of resilience, resourcefulness, respect and tolerance, responsibility and reflection. We will be taking one of these values each term to focus on in our assemblies and PSHE work. I will be starting with resilience in Monday afternoon's assembly and look forward to the children's ideas about what this means and how we can all work to be resilient.

Some of the children in Year 6 sat the Kent Test on Thursday. This is the test (sometimes referred to as the 11+) which children take right at the very start of Year 6 if their families wish them to, if they pass they are able to be considered for a place at one of the grammar schools. We talk parent/carers through this process in the summer of Year 5.

At the other end of the school our new Reception Class children have been superstars, happily coming into school and playing so well together during the day. There is a lot for them to get used to and they have all taken it in their stride. It has been really good to see and hear children and staff getting to know each other this week and to be settling into the routines of school life.
