Message from the Headteacher

Welcome to Term 2 which has certainly started with a bang! As I write this on Friday morning the sun is shining and the air is still – a very sharp contrast to this time yesterday. I thank Darren Marsh our new Site Manager who started with us this week for his efforts in assessing the site today and clearing up the debris. Thank you also to Dominic Castle for his invaluable help whilst we were between site managers and for continuing to support us this week as Mr Marsh settles in.

Staff Training

Staff training on Monday was about ways in which we can continue to support all of our children with their behavioural needs, including those who, for whatever reason, find aspects of life – including school - more challenging.

Some really important messages for us all to think about:

- 1. All behaviour is a form of communication and is often an attempt to control the environment in which we find ourselves.
- 2. No child comes to school with the sole aim to deliberately disrupt.
- 3. Children that need the most love often ask for it in the most unlovable of ways we all need to be their hope, to be their change and to be there for them.

As a staff team we work tirelessly to meet the needs of all member of our school community. We recognise that when a child presents with challenging behaviour at school this will have an effect on other members of the school community. We therefore work to keep everyone safe, to minimise the impact of challenging behaviour, to avoid crisis, to help the child to return to a calm state and to learn to self-regulate their behaviour where they can.

We work with the whole class to help children who do not struggle with managing their own behaviour to understand that we are all different. Each of us has a variety of needs and therefore things need to be done differently for some people – and that is ok.

Issues around behaviours which challenge can be emotive and there is work to be undertaken with the whole school community in coming to a greater understanding about why some people behave as they do and how as a school community we support them, whilst also meeting the needs of *all* of our learners.

Class 5 Family Assembly

Year 5 had an amazing time on their recent residential trip to Bewl Water. Today in their assembly they explained to their parents/carers and all the school, staff and children, what made it just so amazing. We learnt about their archery, axe throwing, climbing walls, canoeing and sailing adventures; about a pirate ship, football, films and popcorn. It was delightful to hear how many memories they made at Bewl Water; memories of friendship, teamwork and water (they did appear to fall in a few times!) which we hope will stay with them throughout their lives.

Well done, Year 5, this was a super assembly and I am so pleased that you had a great time at Bewl Water.
