Understand which letters belong to which handwriting 'families' (i.e., letters that are formed in similar ways) and form these correctly.


Composition:

- Read their writing aloud clearly enough to be heard by their peers and the teacher.


Vocabulary, grammar & punctuation:

- Making doubles


Fractions:

- Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants and trees.


Seasonal Changes
